Benefit Cap – The Revised Benefit Cap has started to be implemented from 7 November 2016 across the United Kingdom, this places a lower cap on the amount of money single claimants or lone parents or large families can receive. In the majority of the UK this is £257.69 per week for a Single Claimant & £384.62 for a couple or lone parent, although there are some incomes which are disregarded as part of this calculation.

Universal Credit – The Rollout schedule Universal Credit from April 2017 to September 2018, has been released by the Department of Work and Pensions on 15 November, a link to this schedule is provided below:
